What means CIC (cultural interdisciplinary communication)?

- How should we develop our teachings and a successful cultural interdisciplinary communication in a world which forgets many basic needs and codes in daily conversations?
- Well, this is the purpose of our presentation to work on these skills and provide useful short guidance guidelines which can be used everywhere.
- CIC means that cultures and communications are put forward through interdisciplinarity. We will now provide the key of the 4 ILC rules.

ILC (Intercultural Linguistics and Communications)

1st ILC (Imagination, Lexicology, Creativity)

- To be fluent in many languages but also to discover much more of this world, ILC is a key to success and unexpected discoveries.
- For example, studying Gaelic poetry will lead you to know more on Scotland (Alba) but also on Gàidhlig which will be a knowledge bridge towards French and Latin (ceart, certain, certus)
(madainn, matin, matinus, Matuta)
- Therefore, here is the 1st ILC (Imagination, Lexicology, Creativity).

2nd ILC (Inspiration, Language, Communicability)

- Indeed, every student and every programme requires specific skills and preparation. But to be able to work for excellent results, the 2nd ILC is essential.
- Your teachings should be oriented on inspiration, true language and communicability.

3rd ILC (Innovative thinking, Living libraries , Concepts)

- In order that everyone could feel prepared and aligned to the challenges of the new societies currently under way, it is important to teach and communicate more on innovative thinking, living libraries (to be shared through workshops, seminars and offline activities), concepts of authentic reading and discussions on real language skills and learning innovations.
- The 3rd ICL will allow any student to bring his/her part into the ICL harmony.

4th ILC (Instrumental Linguistics Case-oriented approach)



- For those of you who love airplanes as much as we do, you certainly know about ILS. Now, we propose the ILC.

Now, a bit of practice, what about French, Portuguese, English in one ILC structure?

ILC (1,2,3,4) must always be oriented on the language we wish to teach.

En français, lancez les études interdisciplinaires en coopération avec vos étudiants et étudiantes en linguistique comparative et communications et demandez-leur de développer leurs outils d'analyse.

For Portuguese, you can use the excellent RTP Ensina platform which can be used for any topic you wish to work in with your students or colleagues.

As for Gaelic, Gàidhlig, use flash and different mnemotechnic cards to visualise better each word.

Le Français est la clé du Gàidhlig which compared to Portuguese will help to learn English philology.(FGPE) but obviously, you can also do EFPG or FPEG or GFEP.
